***If you plan on continuing after graduation for a Nurse Practitioner Program– NURS 574 will not be applied to the Three P’s (Pharmacology, Pathophysiology, Physical Assessment) requirement. You instead will have to contact your academic advisor for a personalized plan of study.**

****IPS 617 requires a 3-day Virtual Experience via Zoom to be completed with course enrollment. These are full class days and will take place during Week 3 of the quarter in which IPS 617 is taken. (Please note: This week is subject to change).**

*****NUPR 618 and NUPR 619 are the Practicum Courses and students will be working with the same preceptor during the entire experience, therefore, NUPR 618 must be taken first and NUPR 619 must be taken in the quarter immediately following.**

Important Notes

- A final grade of B (84) or better is required for each course.
- Students must maintain a 3.00 or better for their final “Term GPA” and “Cumulative GPA”.
- Financial Aid/Student Loans – graduate students who utilize student loans must maintain a minimum enrollment of 4.5 credits per Quarter.
- The Graduate College policy requires students to complete the program within five years of their first enrollment term.
- NUPR 618 and 619 must be taken in sequence. NUPR 619 must be taken in the quarter immediately following NUPR 618. Each practicum course contains 80 practicum hours. Students will be eligible to start the practicum preparation process approximately 6 months before the start of the course.
- If you plan on continuing after graduation for a Nurse Practitioner Program– NURS 574 will not be applied to the Three P’s (Pharmacology, Pathophysiology, Physical Assessment) requirement. You instead will have to contact your academic advisor for a personalized plan of study.
