

A Quick Guide to Elective Course Equivalencies

In order for a course to transfer:

- >it must be 100 level or higher
- >it must be taken at an accredited college
- >you must have earned a C (2.0) or higher

Note: Courses used to satisfy Tier 1 and 2 requirements can not be used again to meet elective requirements.

HUMANITIES ELECTIVE

Literature, Art, Language, Medical Terminology, Music, Theology/Religion, Philosophy Speech Communication/ Public Speaking, Critical Thinking, etc.

"Studio" courses do not count!
(e.g.: Sculpture, Guitar would not count; Art History, Music

SOCIAL SCIENCE ELECTIVE

Anthropology, Economics, Geography, History, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology, and Management.

SCIENCE ELECTIVE

Chemistry, Biology, Advanced Physiology, Pathophysiology, Genetics, Natural Science, Physics, Astronomy.

GENERAL ELECTIVE/OPEN ELECTIVE

Any non-remedial course that is part of an approved curriculum at an accredited college and that has at least an implied theoretical base (such as a practicum) may be used as a general elective.

- May not be a gym course
- May not be a skills course (typing, shorthand)
- May not repeat courses you have already taken; may not use courses used for other Tier 1/Tier 2 transfer credit
